


Tamir Sorek is an Assistant Professor at the Center for Jewish Studies and the Department of Sociology at the University of Florida. He earned his Ph.D. in Sociology and Anthropology at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem in 2002. Sorek's interests center on the processes in which ethnic and national identities are produced and re-produced. His forthcoming book, *Arab Soccer in a Jewish State* (Cambridge University Press, 2007) explores this theme. **Gerard L. Libaridian** holds the Alex Manoogian Chair in Modern Armenian History at the University of Michigan. He was a cofounder of the Zoryan Institute for Contemporary Armenian Studies and Research in Massachusetts and served as a senior-adviser to the former President of Armenia, Levon Ter-Petrossian. From 1983-1988, he served as the editor of the *Armenian Review*. Professor Libaridian's many publications include, *The Challenge of Statehood* (1997) and *Modern Armenia. People. Nation. State.* (2004).
